The Board of County Commissioners has teamed up with Marpan Recycling to help process debris that used to be disposed of at the landfill.

Furniture, steel, metal, cardboard, carpet, construction and demolition debris can now be recycled at the Marpan facility on Woodville Highway for \$38.00 a ton.

"The ones that we can't recycle here will go back to the landfill. And the other things that are special waste, like the electronics or the hazardous waste will go, still go to the landfill. They'll still keep portions of the facility open," said Nancy Paul, the General Manager for Marpan Recycling.

As of January first, the Landfill Operations at the Apalachee facility will be closed to the general public. It's located at 7550 Apalachee Parkway.

The Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center and the Electronics Recycling Center will be open Monday thru Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and the Rural Waste Service Center will be open Monday thru Saturday from 7 a.m. until 5 p.m.

Marpan Recycling is located at 6020 Woodville Highway and is open Monday thru Friday from 7 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. and 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. on Saturday.
