## **Marpan Recycling's facility to open Thursday**

Recycling will officially open its doors for business Thursday at 10 a.m., giving the area an additional means of disposal for construction and demolition (C&D) debris.

Marpan's facility on Woodville Highway one mile south of Capital Circle is set up to recycle a range of material types, including steel, aluminum, glass, plastics, wood and various building materials.

"We are excited to finally be able to bring a world-class recycling facility to Leon County," said owner Kim Williams. "Now everyone from professional haulers to residents in our region will have a sensible and green option for handling construction, demolition and yard waste."

Marpan Recycling has been designed to make hauling and dumping quicker, easier, and less expensive than other alternatives, Williams noted. The operation has a series of conveyors and automated processing devices that enables the company to sort and recycle up to 70 percent of the incoming material.

The facility will be open Monday through Saturday and is equipped with two scales. General manager Nancy Paul said area residents who have been taking their construction debris, old furniture, scrap metals and yard waste to landfills can bring those materials to Marpan.
